Its psychedelic swirls and colours are hypnotic. It really packs a punch – and just goes to show how much energy a small space can take.’

While there are plenty of opportunities to experiment, Ed also notes that working with a smaller room gives you the option to rethink and redesign if your original vision doesn’t come to life. ‘The small dimensions of a powder room are easy to manage, so if you felt you’d gone too far with an idea you had for acid-bright colour blocking or wall-to-wall disco ball tiles, it’s less of an upheaval to undo your handiwork and start from scratch,’ he explains. Luxurious Marble

If bright colours and dizzying patterns aren't your style, you can't go wrong with a bit of sleek marble – which pairs particularly well with colour-drenched walls.

'The powder room is the perfect place to carve out a design statement away from the rest of the home through bold paint colours, wallpaper, and decorative accents such as mirrors and wall lighting,' says Claire Sá, co-founder of De Rosee Sa.
