

New show unit goes on display at JTRE London's Triptych Bankside, where resi sales have now topped £200mn.

JTRE London has lifted the lid on the latest show apartment at its Triptych Bankside scheme.


Designed by Angel O'Donnell, the three-bed sub-penthouse is one of the best units at the 266,000 sq ft, Squire & Partners-designed project, and is being pitched at just under £5mn.



The site neighbours Tate Modern, and art aficionados are sensibly a key target; works on display include surrealist, colour-soaked photograph by Ulas & Merve, a figurative water colour by Jack Penny, and an expressive abstract by the influential post-war artist Michael Finn.

The open-plan living area has been arranged to make the most of the views of the Thames; and the statement glossy-red dining table and multi-aspect sofa have both been designed by Angel O'Donnell exclusively for the development.

Other notable features include the bespoke joinery unit in the living room; black-lacquered beechwood chairs; a hand-glazed ceramic pendant light; hand-crafted travertino rosso coffee table; and a handblown glass spot table, designed to cast "liquid-green shadows" when the sun hits. The main bedroom suite enjoys the same knockout vista across the river towards St Paul's and sports a bespoke burlwood headboard.



The £450mn scheme – JTRE's first foray into the London market – has been setting some new price benchmarks for the area recently; a number of the apartments have achieved north of £3,500 per square foot, and total resi sales have now topped the £200mn mark.



Residents of the 169 apartments are served by a 24-hour reception, multiple private lounges, games room, gym, private 14-seater cinema, co-working space, communal landscaped gardens and parking. The project is also delivering 87,000 sq ft of office space, and 9,900 sq ft of retail.
